Hector Cross is Predator. Before reading this book, I had heard a lot of good things about Wilbur Smith, but Predator is the first of his books that I have read. Predator is the third book in the Hector Cross series (yes, I know - breaking my rule of not reading books in a series out of order!) but I feel it gives sufficient background to be read as a standalone too. Fast-paced, high-drama thrillers like these are often a bit of a marmite genre for me - I seem to either love them or hate them. While I definitely didn't hate Predator, sadly, I didn't enjoy it as much as I hoped I would either. I struggled to find myself invested in the storyline and didn't really form any personal attachments to any of the characters, which left a big disconnect. This isn't to say that the characters were not fully formed - because they were - I just couldn't connect to any of them on an emotional level, which is important to me when reading. Of course, the stakes were high and the plot hurtled along at a breakneck pace, but for all the action and adventure, actual engagement with the story was low. I struggled to get through the book and had to make myself pick it up to keep on reading more than once - definitely not a good sign. Predator covers a lot of ground and in my opinion, could have benefitted from being simplified in order to allow more time to focus on various parts of the story. As a result, I felt the beginning was too drawn out and the ending was too rushed, making it feel a little anticlimactic. Wilbur Smith continues the story of Hector Cross, the ex-SAS officer we have met in two previous novels. Cross lost his wife to a killer he has tracked, found and returned to the United States. The book starts with Cross awaiting the news of the death of Johnny Congo, the killer. He has been given the death penalty and all is secure for this to take place. The corruption and complexities of Congo's contacts are detailed as we await justice. This is a fast-paced book, swinging from the African oilfields to Alaska as we follow Cross in his role as an oilfield industry Security chief. There is a little romance, fatherhood as Hector Cross now has a young daughter to care for, and plenty of uncertainty. The baddies are very bad, the goodies are flawed, but generally try to do the best they can. At times, I was little bogged down in detail as the four different stories played out on different continents with associated groups of friends or foes. Trying to sustain the different characters and settings, while keeping the pace up, seemed to present a real challenge. Eventually, it all comes together in a storm on the high seas. Former operative Major Hector Cross is a man who makes "his own rules. He lived in a world of violence wherein wrongs were avenged with biblical ruthlessness: an eye for an eye and a life for a life" (4). William Morrow In the novel's opening scene Cross is entangled in an unbelievably intense nightmare involving a crocodile who has the capacity to morph into a human being who is none other than Carl Hancock, a close business associate who killed Cross's first wife, Hazel. Hancock may be dead, but Johnny Congo is still on death row for the part he played in Hazel's death. Thus this cloying dream torments Cross with increased frequency... especially after Congo escapes! Lawyer Jo Stanley, Cross's current girlfriend, blames herself when she hears the news. After all, rather than let him take the law into his own hands as he did with Hancock, she had persuaded Cross to let the courts determine Congo's fate. Throughout the pages of Predator, Smith and Cain reveal the oil industry's sinister motives and introduce characters who have no regard for human life, all the while allowing readers to sift through the various layers of truth. One thing I really appreciated here is how the authors show us the evolution of Cross's psyche over the course of this novel. In the beginning, he is hyper focused on bringing his first wife's killers to justice. But as the novel takes shape and Cross hunts down Congo in what becomes a breathtaking game of cat and mouse, he also does his best to protect those closest to him from the sociopathic killer.
